Van Camp Ranch
June 22, 1935

Dear Mother + Dad,

I don't think you had to buy a new battery because Paul just bought one a few months ago. I am glad to hear you are getting along with the car so well. Be careful and don't wreck it.

I am feeling fine now and my face and arms are sun tan. I have been working up at our camp in the hot sun for the past 5 days. We have camp almost ready and we are going up to stay Monday. We have built a log frame for our tent about like the ones they have at Scout Camp. This idea gives us a lot more room inside our tent. The ridge pole is $9\frac{1}{2}$ feet from the ground and at the wall up to where the tent starts to angle for the roof it is $5\frac{1}{2}$ feet. I have my bed fixed up using the springs I got from Shideler's and it is going to work well. Gordy has fixed his springs much like I have mine. Our tent is pitched right next to some small pine trees and from our front door we can see a fine covered mountain

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right in front of us and pine trees protruding from high rocky peaks on the right of our camp. It is the best place for a camp I have ever seen. Our camp is 5 miles from the ranch and we have to open and close 14 gates between the ranch and camp. We saw bear tracks around the spring where we get our water. The woods is full of deer and elk. Paul has seen some coyotes and he has had a lot of fun shooting ground hogs and gophers. There are all kinds of wild flowers in the mountains and it makes the whole woods fragrant. There is one place I have seen so far in the cañon that looks a lot like Turkey Run. The sunsets out here are sure pretty and you can see the different colors in the rainbow reflecting on the snow capped mountains.

We are going on a picnic up to Spring Creek tomorrow. That is where Bill's grandmother's place is. We are also going to a ranch to watch them shear sheep tomorrow.

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They don't have any sheep at this ranch now but they are getting some this fall. I haven't ridden any for two days but it sure is a lot of fun. We don't take any chances on the horses. I have a lot to learn about riding but maybe by the end of the summer I will be a little better.

I lost a little weight while I was sick but I have put on weight in the past few days. I feel swell and this outdoor life is going to help me a lot physically.

What did Uncle Dave have to say about the trip? I am glad you got the check and 19.25 is right. I am surprised he brought it out. I am going to write to him and Aunt Clara some time soon.

It is 8³⁰ now and it is very light yet. I haven't used a light to go to bed by yet. Paul is reading the magazines you sent. You can see if they will read the Collins out here, I would like to get it if I could.
